

Summer Work

Dear Parents,

Happy Summer! Welcome to 3rd Grade! Attached to this letter you will find your child's summer work. I have included reading lists, a summer journal, and a summer math packet. You will also find a calendar with assignments. I know that a lot of you will be taking trips this summer so **please do not feel pressured** to do the assignment on that specific date. The calendar is used to keep the assignments organized, and keep your child on track to finish the work! It is very important that your child does a few assignments each week, rather than completing all the work at once! This is to ensure that their brains stay active to avoid any chance of a, "summer slump". 1. **Reading List:** There are two mandatory books for your child to read. One is Sarah, Plain and Tall by Patricia Maclachlan, and then they can **choose** one of the Non-Fiction books from the list. There are a few activities that are included for these books! I also included some other suggestions of books for your child to read over the summer, however these are not mandatory!
2. **Reading Log:** I have included a reading log, every time your child **finishes** a book they should record it on the log! If they finish the log they will be able to pick from the prize box on the first day of school. I cannot stress the importance of reading, it is so important that your child is reading **at least** 15-20 minutes every other day!
3. **Summer Journal:** In the summer journal there are several different activities for your child to write and draw about. The calendar will tell them which prompt to do, they go in order in the journal. I would like your child to be practicing script and print in here. If they need more room there are extra pages in the back.
4. **Summer Math Packet:** The first page in this packet is titled, "Summer Activities" in this page your child can select the activity they would like to do. They do not need to turn their work in, they can do this part on their own. When they finish the activity they color in that box, they should not repeat activities, this assignment will be labeled **Summer Box Math Activity** on the calendar (They **will not** complete all of these, this gives your child choice on the activity they would like to complete). In this packet there are also numbered worksheets. On the calendar it will say, Math Worksheet # (this will tell your child which worksheet they should complete that day!
